IGCSE Ceremony 2017


After a long period of waiting – our students wrote their IGCSE exams in May – they could finally receive their certificates.

We are very happy to inform you that **Year 8** won an award after taking part in a competition regarding Wilhelm Busch & Co.

The class, on behalf of the initiative Ms Selke, took part in last year's competition from the Reisebüro Schmidt GmbH. The students were warmly received in the SchmidtTerminal in Wolfenbüttel by the CEO Mr Wilhelm Schmidt. The theme of this competition was Wilhelm Busch and his works. He was a significant German poet and writer and one of the first ones who wrote and published a comic. Among the awards was a price endowed with 500 Euro and a class trip to Hannover to the "Wilhelm Busch – Deutsches Museum für Karikatur und Zeichenkunst". Although our students were the youngest, they were able to win a price. Well done! The five students (**Jasmin, Miyu, Lena, Marc and Rohan**) really deserved it. Lena who went to the award ceremony kindly took the price.

Vanitas Year 11 visited the Herzog Anton Ulrich Museum. The reason for our visit was to analyze drawings of Vanitas. Vanitas was one of the important genre of art during the 17th century. We compared the interpretation between the contemporary and Baroque symbols of Vanitas. At the exhibition, we looked at modern interpretations of "Nichts ist, das ewig sei ..." Intervention.



This exhibition was made by students of the HBK, Braunschweig University of Art. We were able to identify the different symbols which Vanitas used to fully express his emotions concerning life and death during this time in art history. The different symbols used included glasses of red wine and bread which represented the blood and body of Jesus Christ, peeled lemons which represented vulnerability, half eaten cakes which represented wealth, etc.

The students carried out these activities eagerly. The last team–building activity was even more animated as the goal was to carry a small ball through some plastic tubes without letting it fall. This required a lot of cooperation and teamwork between the students, which was clearly visible throughout the task. Some groups worked better than others, but it was satisfying to see a lot of interaction between them, as well as having a lot of fun. This project was incredibly beneficial in building new, stronger relationships between the students and helping them form new friendships. Primary Afternoon Room


