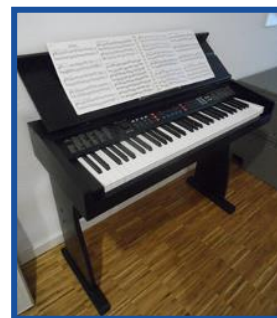

Year 4

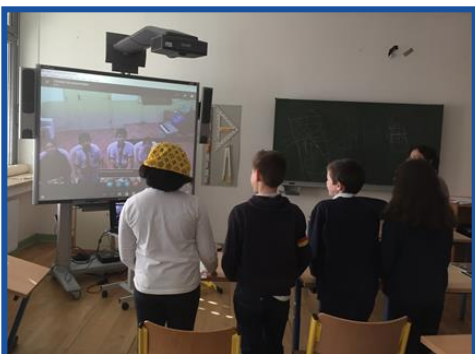

Year 11 IB Diploma Exchange visit to the GEMS Modern Academy – Dubai

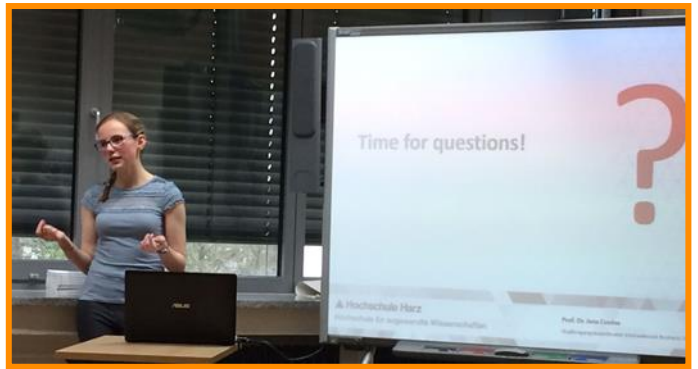

Cultural exchange assists students to develop positive relationships with others, understand a broader range of perspectives, and develop the knowledge and skills needed for participation in our multicultural society.

Our school and especially our IB Diploma Department accepted the invitation from the GEMS Modern Academy–Dubai, not only to visit the U.A.E from 4th–10th March, but work collaboratively and determine the goal/s, content and intended outcomes of their program (IB Diploma), including the learning and social outcomes that they hope to achieve. Goals often change as the program evolves and so programs should be flexible enough to allow for this change and, importantly, incorporate teaching and learning around the value of flexibility within collaborative, inter cultural contexts. This is the beauty of the IB Diploma program.

While all Key Learning Areas may be used to provide a focus for cultural exchange programs, our two schools are focusing on Group 1, Group 3, Group 4, Group 6 and the Core components of the IB Diploma Program like CAS and TOK.

Additionally, it breaks down the subject matter very simply, making the material easy for the students to absorb. Although most of the online topics are charged, some of the topics are free for students and it is highly recommended in the IB examination preparation process. Our Mathematics SL and TOK teacher Dr.Selvadurai has had an intensive webinar training for using the Studynova portal and administering the “Revisionvillage” topic based exam preparation material. We wish that all students from our IB Diploma group make use of this opportunity which definitely helps them in securing better grades in their final examinations.
